Sydney Aquarium Conservation Fund Mission Statement

"Sydney Aquarium Conservation Fund is a not for profit organisation that will fund and support research, education and conservation initiatives to increase our understanding of Australia's aquatic flora, fauna and ecology with a focus on Sydney Harbour. Through increased knowledge and public awareness gained from this research, protection and restoration of species and habitats will be facilitated while ensuring the sustainable use of our harbour".

Sydney Aquarium Conservation Fund Inc ("SACF") is an independent not-for-profit association that is:

Committed to "thinking globally and acting locally" by raising general public awareness of the need for worldwide ecological sustainability while focusing on conservation and research into the aquatic organisms and environments of Australia with a strong focus on Sydney Harbour and its tributaries;

Intent on showing the general public that Sydney Harbour and its associated bioregions is a viable natural environment that requires our help through research, education and public awareness to help sustain its fragile ecosystems;

Supportive of other associations and institutions that are acting positively towards the environment and will strive to unite and work collaboratively with those organisations;

Aware of Sydney Harbour as potentially the most recognisable harbour in the world, one of the most publicly used water bodies in the world, and one of Sydney's greatest assets but is requiring our help to understand and protect its aquatic organisms and environments into the future.

SACF raises money through fundraising activities, grants and sponsorship arrangements to fund and support scientific and educational projects that have *applied conservation outcomes* aimed at conserving, protecting, restoring or fostering sustainable use of Australian aquatic species, habitats and resources.

Research findings and educational information gathered from these projects and activities are disseminated to the public through our close association with the Sydney Aquarium and Oceanworld Manly. This facilitates an understanding of the need for the conservation of Australian aquatic organisms and environments as well as the sustainable use of our unique harbour. Information is also disseminated via events held at Sydney Aquarium and Oceanworld, our website www.sacf.org.au, a quarterly newsletter, and through networks of other organisations with which SACF has a working relationship.

SACF funds key scientific research and aquatic conservation education projects and works with State and Federal Governments, universities, local communities and other environmental NGOs including the National Parks Association of NSW, the Nature Conservation Council of NSW, Landcare/Coastcare, WWF and Australian Wildlife Conservancy (AWC).

Organisation

SACF is a not for profit aquatic conservation organisation that was listed on the Register of Environmental Organisations (REO) from 14 October 2008. This enables SACF to receive Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) status which will allow tax deduction receipts to be issued for donations to the Sydney Aquarium Conservation Fund Public Fund over \$2.
